

Unit 1 – Vector – Illustrator Guide

How to download fonts (Mac os)

Choose a font from your favorite font site.

Unzip the file from your downloads folder.

Then go to your Applications Folder to your “Font Book”

Drag your Font file (.ttf or .otf) into the list of Fonts in the Font Book

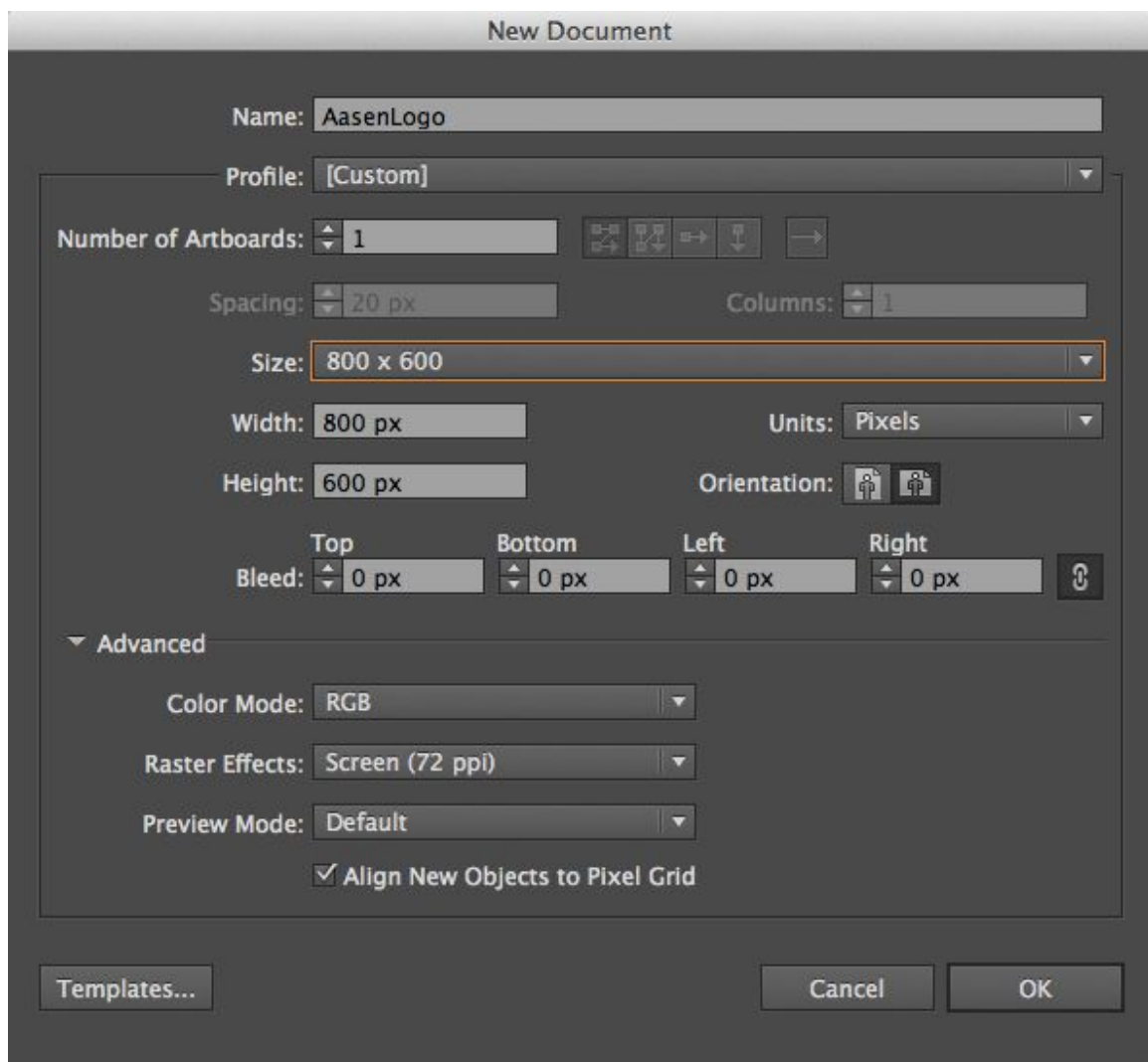
Under Windows 8/7/Vista

Select the font files (.ttf, .otf or .fon) then Right-click > Install

Open Illustrator – Brown/Orange “Ai” Adobe Icon

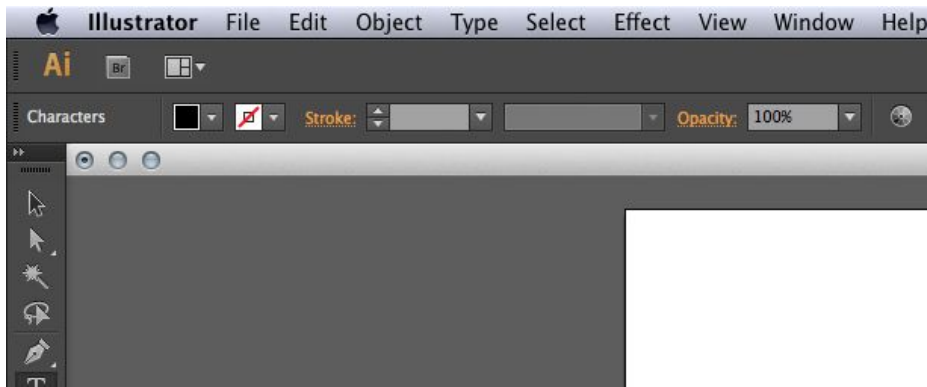
Open a new document

File> New or ⌘N



Name your Document
Profile: Web
Size: 800 x 600
Orientation: Horizontal or Vertical
Click ok.

You can Modify the sizes for inches If needed, until “units” you can choose inches, pixels etc



Up top you have Illustrator, File, Edit, Object, Type, Select, Effect, View, Window, and Help.

File: New, Open, Save, Close, and Print

Edit: Undo, Redo, Cut, Copy, and Paste

Object: This includes everything about your Pen tool and Shapes. The Transformation, Arrange, Expand, ETC

Type: More Information on your Type, Includes a better look at your Fonts

Select: Groups things together, easy for moving from one artboard to another artboard.

Effect: Think like Filters in Photoshop *Play Around with These!*

View: Zoom In/Out

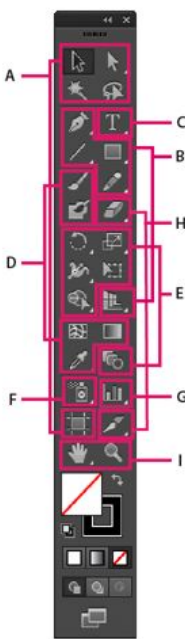
Window: Brings open things you may need on your workspace, if you cannot find something, look in here

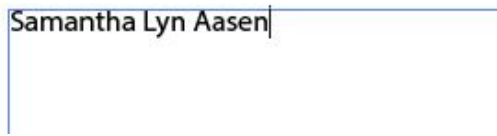

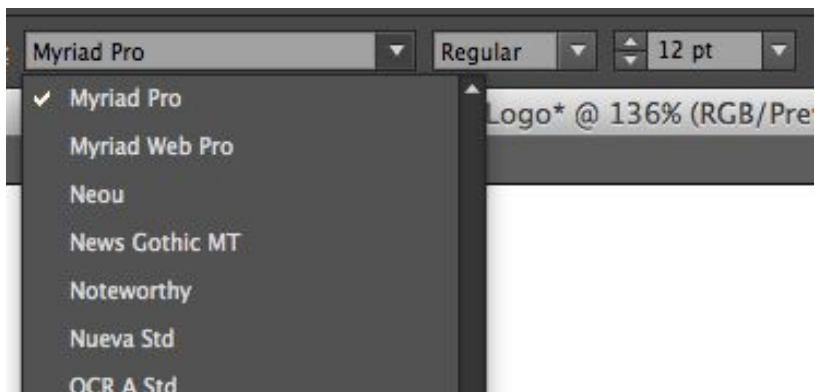
Placing Text on your Artboard

Click on the Text icon  and drag the blue box on your art board.

Type what ever your “Logo” name is for work.



Up top you can choose your Font, Font Weight, and Size of your text.



Play around with various fonts and sizes. **remember that Vector graphics in the .AI file are scalable**



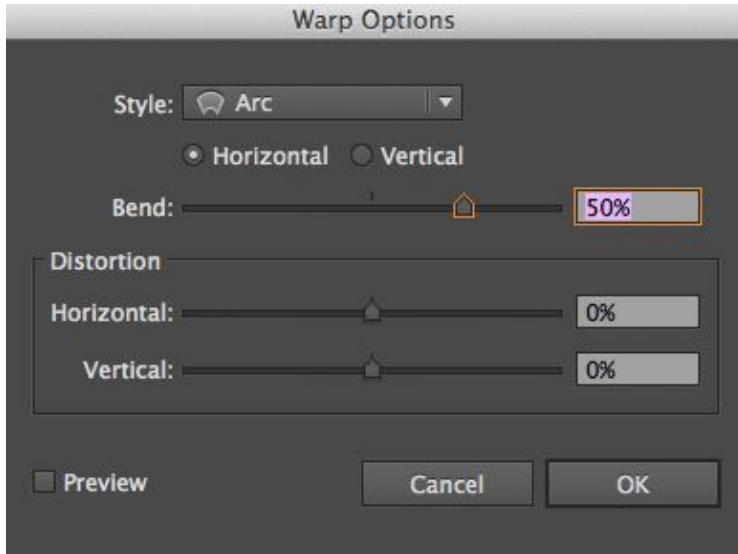
Once you have settled on your decided font and text size, you may want to “jazz it up”

Warp Tool

The icon for the warped tool is up above is near your settings for Text



Click on it you get the tools to warp the text.



You may want to check “Preview” to see how you are adjusting all the parameters. From various styles, Horizontal / Vertical, Bend etc. there are unlimited ways to use this function.



Playing with Individual Letters

You may want to try “ungrouping” your text to give each Letter it’s own special treatment. This takes the one object of all your words into separate objects. Press “V” to Select your all of your Text. Then go to **Type> Create Outlines** Then, make sure all of your text highlighted. And Press “Shift-Ctrl-G”

Your Text will look like this and your layers board will look like:



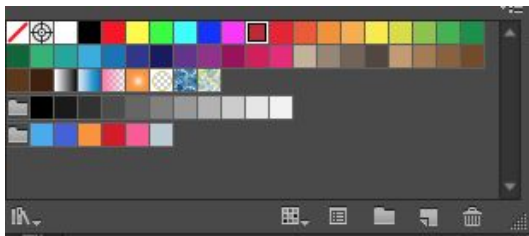
You can Zoom in and treat each object like “PATHS” and use the Pen tool.

Changing Font Color

Once you have decided on the warp you may want to try out other color combinations. Highlight your text or ⌘A Then on the left of your Text settings you click on this icon.



Click on the drop down

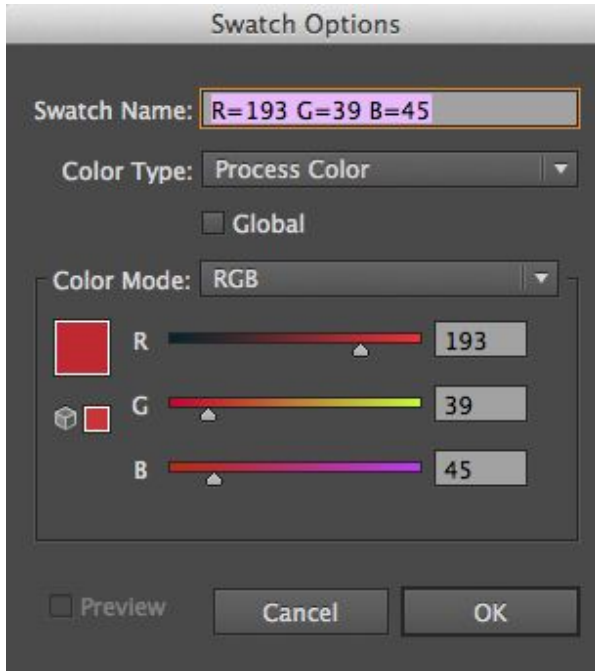


here are some of your color swatches, which you can always add too if you find yourself using a specific color multiple times in Illustrator.

To adjust a color click on the second icon (to the left of the folder)



Which brings down a new drop box to adjust colors.

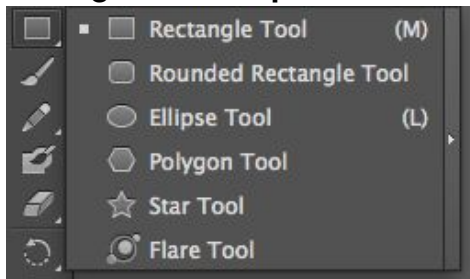


Here you can adjust the *Tint* of your color, and other variables to get the correct *hue* you desire. Be sure to check the “preview” box to see exactly what you are adjusting.

Adding Other Shapes or Banners



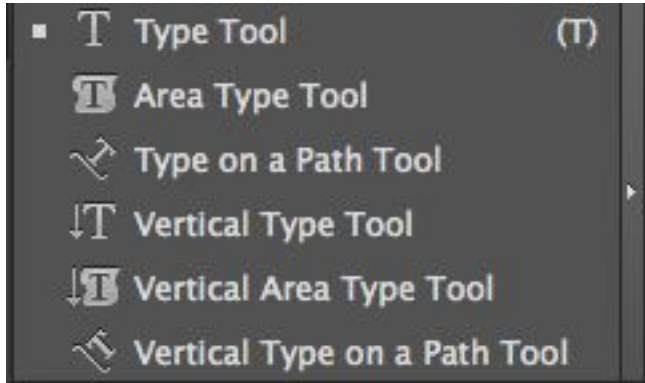
You can use the shaped Illustrator Provides, or draw while using the Pen Tool. Make Sure you draw the new object on your layers panel *behind* your text.

Then you can use the same effect under EFFECTS.

Other Text Options

On the tool bar if you click and hold down on the text icon A new dialog box opens with more options.

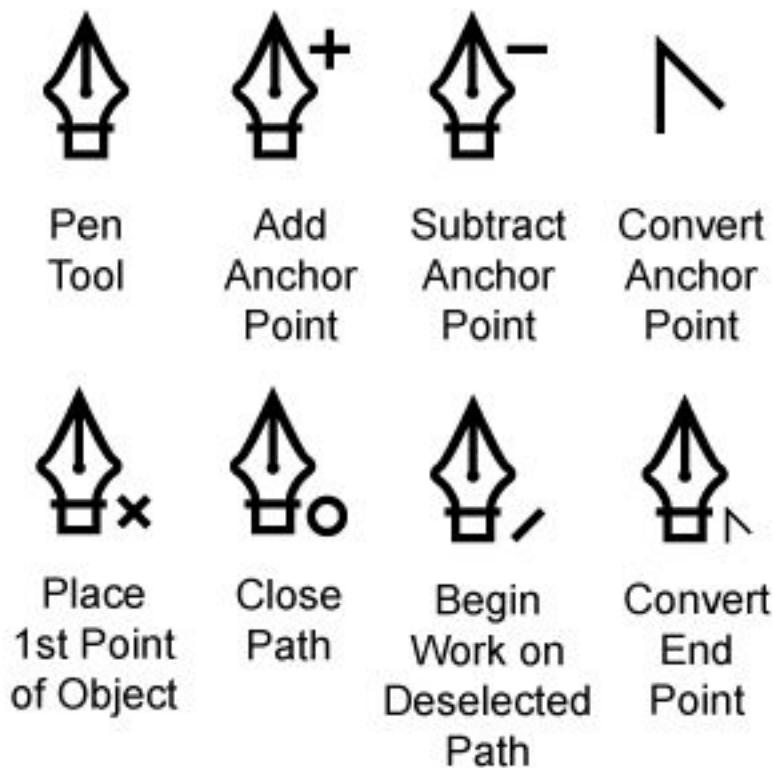




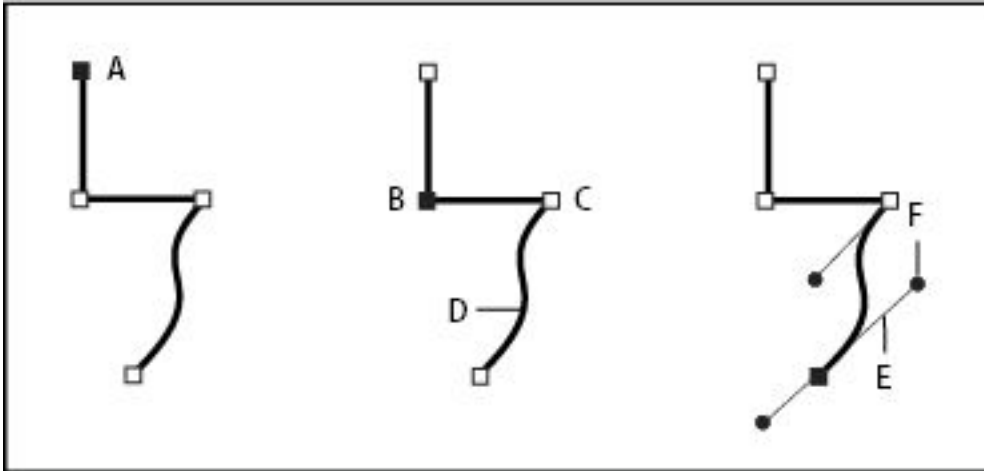
You can place text on a Path (remember the Powerpoint) to make a very different orientations for your text, allowing even limitless opportunities for the Logo. I will show "Type on a Path Tool" for this tutorial, feel free to play with all of the type tools.

Type on a Path Tool (Text)

You must begin with a Path, which you create with a pen tool. Here is a quick explanation of the pen tool from Adobe.com

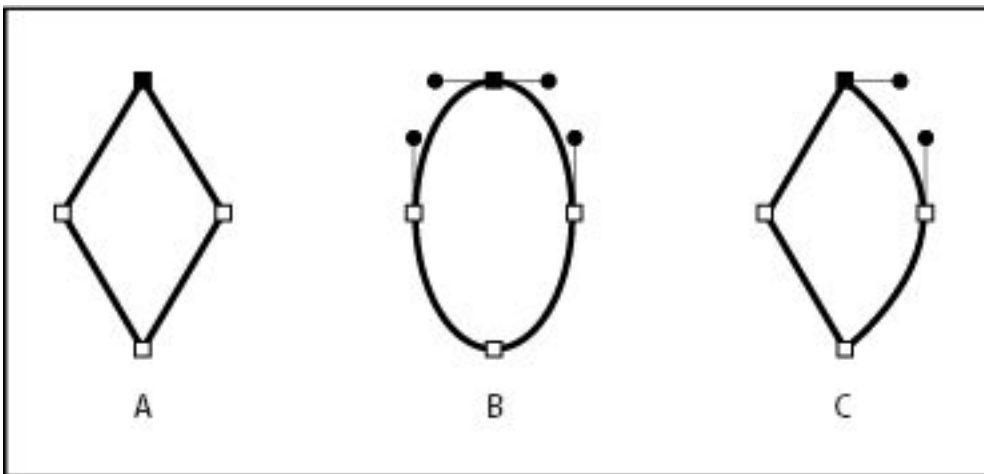


Different styles of the pen tools



Components of a path

- A.** Selected (solid) endpoint
- B.** Selected anchor point
- C.** Unselected anchor point
- D.** Curved path segment
- E.** Direction line
- F.** Direction point



Points on a path

- A.** Four corner points
- B.** Four smooth points
- C.** Combination of corner and smooth points

Drawing with the pen tool takes a lot of practice. Think about plotting points on the X&Y axis as the anchor points

The shape tools can also help with simple shapes like circles and rectangles.

Drawing your Path

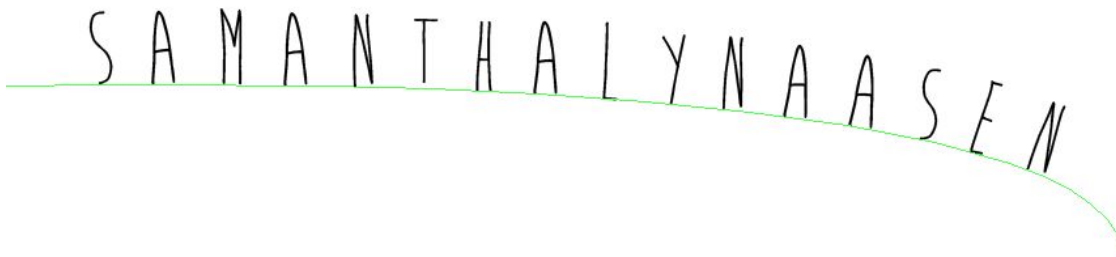
Using my pen tool I made sure to have no color, so I do not have part of my “text on path” a partial full shape.



Then I began drawing my shape, take your time, and it will take many attempts.



Here is my path, then I go to my text tool and choose “Type on a Path tool”



After playing around with spacing, I come to this final one.

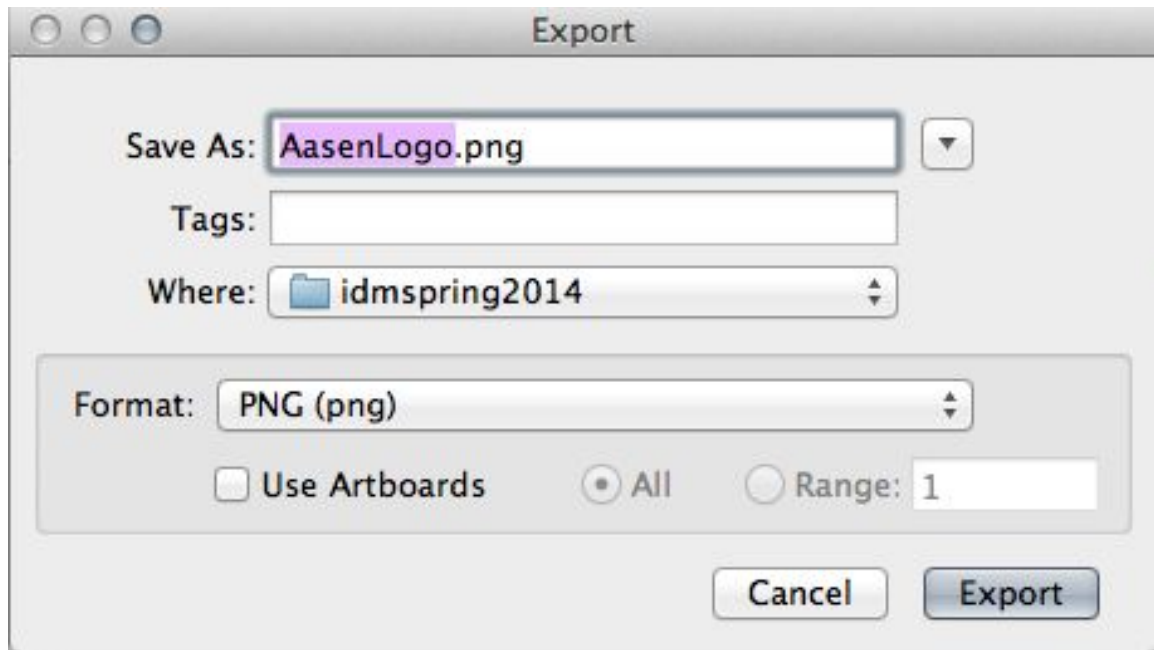

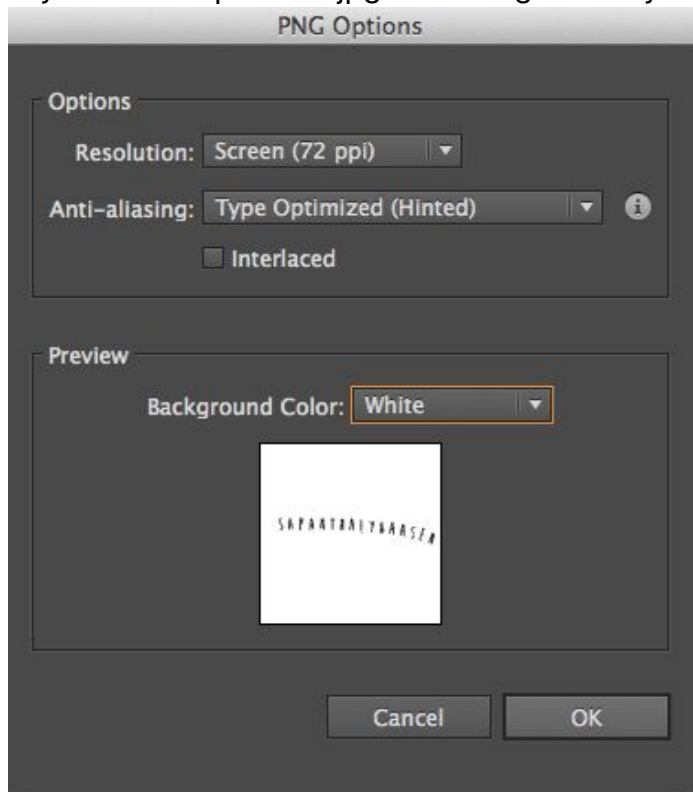
Saving and Exporting

Make sure to save your file as a “.ai” file often. This will save you from crashes. Your .ai file will be only readable in Adobe, saving all of what makes it a vector based file.

You export for finals, or view for web.
File>Export and a new screen will appear



You can choose PNG for the purpose of this class, but note it is a large file. You may want to export for .jpg or even .gif when you use for web or print.



You can up the resolution or *DPI*, but 72 is recommend for web or screen viewing. You can have a transparent, white or black background, as it was not predetermined in Illustrator.
